

Domestic-Basic Freeform Feathers

Domestic Quilting Basic Freeform Feathers

This class teaches the student how to free motion quilt four basic shapes.

After the student has practiced the shapes we will put them together to create a meandering feather, and many other quilting patterns without having to mark your top.

Supplies needed:

6-22" Squares of muslin (no Polyester).

3 25" squares of squares of batting. I like Hobb's wool bat.

50 weight Machine Quilting thread,
(Signature or Star brands work best for beginners)

Blue Water soluble Pen.

2 boards: 1/2" by 3" 26" long. Cover with muslin to protect your quilt.

If you are traveling to class please don't bring boards.

Sewing Machine in good working order. (That feed dogs drop)

Stipple foot, single needle plate,

Extension table for machine (a must).

90/14 machine embroidery needles,

Tweezers, thimble,

100% cotton Tatting thread for basting, (Top Stitch thread will work), basting needle,

Glycerin for hands, or Quilting gloves,
