

This class will teach you how to use Piec-liqué in creating your own art work. I will show you how to make your own pattern and how to construct your original design. This class is designed for the experienced quilter that wants to move onto a higher level of work. Every art quilter will love this class. If you have loved curved seams but were afraid to try them now is the time.

Supplies Needed:

Assorted Fabrics:

Because you will be designing your own bring what you like, make sure that you bring plenty. The brighter the better.

Equipment needed:

Sewing machine.
You won't need your sewing machine until in the 2nd day.
Quarter inch piecing foot.
A single needle plate for your sewing machine.
Size 75 machine embroidery needles.
Mettler size 50/3 cotton thread (beige or gray) for piecing.
Basic sewing Kit.
Hard pressing Mat.
Regular spray starch. (No spray sizing)
Freezer paper.
Small stencil brush (small).
Water Soluble Basting Glue
Permanent marking pen.
Surgical tweezers,
Scissors (Paper and fabric scissors).

Iron: You will need your own.

The only one that I find is hot enough to work is a Black and Decker travel iron or a Rowena travel iron. You will need to purchase one. A must no other iron works.



Try to use hand dyes or batiks if possible.

If you choose to make this butterfly you will need:

Assorted fabrics:

3 yards black for back ground.
1 1/2 yard of green for border.
1 1/2 yard of multi color for sky behind the butterfly.
20-30 fat quarters of assorted colors, Preferably gradations.
Some fabrics variegate in the same yardage. This fabric will work fine.
Use your imagination on the colors you choose the brighter the better.
